What does SISP publish?

SISP is non-profit, open access scholarly publisher that publishes research results of Smithsonian scholars and about Smithsonian collections. Its principal products are open access monographs (i.e., discipline-specific technical monograph series and edited collections, including conference proceedings).

Can I submit my manuscript to SISP?

Check WHO IS ELIGIBLE.

I'm eligible. Now what?
